



The following is a detailed description of the protocols we will be following at our So Fly Kids, Inc. Summer Camp. [We will be following the LA County Day-Camp Protocol found here](#) and the [ACA field guide found here](#). Camp begins July 6, 2020 and will run Monday through Friday, 8:30-3:30, through August 14.

**Our facility has been deep cleaned (CDC certified) and will continue weekly. Medical Grade Filtration H13 True HEPA air purifiers have been installed throughout.**

**\*SFK is proud to announce that we will have a Registered Nurse on-site all summer to lead our morning check-ins and monitor our campers and staff at all times.\***

#### **Summary of Daily Camp Safety Practices:**

- Special staff training by a registered nurse will be given to all SFK staff on covid-19 sanitization, best practices, and other safety measures.
- Drop-off and pick-up will be directly at the studio, and spaced out with social distancing markers.
- NO parents or outsiders allowed in our facility, strictly campers and staff.
- Masks and face shields will be required by all staff, all day.
- Masks for campers and parents will be required to check-in/out and encouraged for campers throughout the day.
- Wellness screenings for campers and staff will be taken at the start of each day, including touchless thermometer readings.
- A touchless hand washing station will be placed at the entrance of our facility.
- Touchless hand sanitizer will be placed throughout the facility.
- There will be 2 groups or “pods” of no more than 12 campers per pod, as recommended by LA County Department of Health.
- No more than 2 staff members will be assigned to each pod.
- Pods will remain constant throughout each week, and will not intermingle.
- Activities will be adjusted to have little to no contact with plenty of outside time.
- Each group will have their own set of games, equipment, and materials that will stay with them the entire week, disinfected daily.
- Handwashing will take place before and after every activity.



- Hospital grade disinfectant will be used on the entire facility, including before/after each activity.
- Lunch will be provided in non-reusable prepackaged meals. Disposable utensils will be provided and safely packed in the meal kits.

#### **FIELD TRIPS & BEACH DAYS**

- We have eliminated field trips and instead will bring socially distanced vendors to our facility on Wednesdays.
- We will be having Beach Day in Playa Del Rey on Tuesdays and Thursday.
- We will not be using a bus rental company, but instead, have procured an individually owned, company van.
- Transportation to and from the beach will be one pod of 12 at a time with staggered departure and arrival times.
- The van will be sprayed with hospital grade disinfectant between each use.
- Each group will be kept in their separate areas with their own pop-up tent, equipment, & toys.

#### **Further Details of Specific Safety Practices:**

We will begin training for our camp counselors and staff on July 3rd, 2020 to ensure they are prepared to follow our health and safety standards. A Registered Nurse will be training our staff on how to sanitize and maintain a safe environment for our campers and staff. Disposable masks, gloves, and face shields will be used and provided by So Fly Kids. If a staff member exhibits any signs/symptoms of the novel Coronavirus, they will be asked to stay home.

Before each camp day, staff will have their temperature taken and fill out a wellness survey. Campers are asked to arrive between 8:30am and 9:00am, staggering out arrivals as much as possible to avoid a large gathering. Masks are required to drop off campers and will be encouraged though the entire day. There are markers on the floor outside of So Fly Kids implementing a 6 feet apart rule. Pens to sign-in will be sanitized after each use. Campers will have their temperature taken with a touchless thermometer and a parent or guardian will fill out a wellness survey before entry. No parent or outside visitors (besides our once weekly SFK approved vendor) will be allowed into our facility. There will be a portable hand washing station at the entry with a touchless hand soap.



dispenser. Each camper and staff member are required to wash their hands prior to entering.

Camp attendance will be limited. Groups will be no larger than 12 campers to one lead counselor and one assistant. Groups will remain constant throughout the week of camp and will not intermingle with one another. Siblings/those who live together will be placed in the same group. Activities within the stable groups will have little to no contact with one another. Markers will be placed in each room to visibly show social distance practices. Markers will also be in place to separate campers' belongings e.g. shoes, water bottles, jackets. Lunch and snacks are provided by Organic Kids LA, and outside food is not allowed. This will guarantee pre-packed, disposable containers and utensils that cannot be reused or shared.

Handwashing will be taking place before and after each activity. The facility will be disinfected between every activity with hospital grade cleaning spray: Vital-Oxide. Professional cleaners will be in each week to deep-clean. The HVAC double filter has been replaced, and Medical Grade Filtration H13 True HEPA air purifiers have been installed throughout to provide the best air quality as possible. Each pod has their own inside room and own bathroom that will be maintained throughout the week. We will rotate our inside activities with outside activities daily.

Field trips have been replaced by in-person, socially distanced vendors. We have added two beach days per week for extra fresh air and sunshine. Campers will only travel in our So Fly Kids van to ensure the groups will remain separate. The van will be sanitized with hospital grade disinfectant before and after each use. At the beach, each pod will have their individual pop-up tent, equipment and toys for use, and departures and arrivals will be per individual group.

Pick-up will be done one at a time and staggered similar to drop-off. Campers will wait inside on their marker until their parent/guardian checks them out. Masks are required for pick up. Those picking up their camper must remain outside using designated signage/markers until it is their turn.
